Program

Kim Wietzorek, who once worked as a social worker, and retired middle school teacher Ellen Braun from the Women of Bethel Shoe Fund explained that sixteen percent of District 205's students come from low-income families who cannot always afford to buy shoes for their children. Every school in the district is affected. Relying on the knowledge and experience of the district's social workers to identify these kids, the Shoe Fund hand delivers vouchers to the parents who can redeem them at Elmhurst's Shoe Carnival store.

Shoe Carnival only bills the Shoe Fund for that portion of the vouchers actually used, a process that allows the Shoe Fund to reallocate unused voucher dollars to future needs.

Requests have escalated and last year involved 78 families and 129 children. Vouchers worth \$11,900 were issued. Although the Women of Bethel have held a number of events to generate funds for shoes, they are always looking for ways to raise money to meet the increasing demand.

The Shoe Fund was started 53 years ago by women from Bethel UCC and other local churches but now the Women of Bethel are solely responsible for the project. Although the need for kids' shoes has grown significantly, Bethel Church has been creative in its fund raising for shoes and thus far, no kids have been turned away. Kim and Ellen expressed their appreciation several times for our club's assistance.
