Remember, this format saves members from having to buy expensive dinner tickets, money which can be spent on fundraiser for our <u>many</u> good projects.

The Nominating Committee in the person of Dave McKenna, is back in person and looking for candidates for the president-elect, secretary, and a board member for the 2024-25 Rotary year. Remember, when a Rotarian is asked to do something, the answer is always "**YES**".
