Program

Beginning with the statement that nobody asked him to do this program, our very own Ken Bartels took a hard look at our club's roster and reminded us that we have about half the number of members that we did about twenty years ago. Furthermore, we are only seeing about a dozen at each meeting. The rub? Most club business is planned and managed before, during, or after club meetings.

While we continue to do many good things for our wider community, we could do even more if we had more members at meetings (and more members in total). Also, more members lead to better fundraising results which enable the club to do more with scholarships and aid more humanitarian efforts in our wider community.

Ken suggested a plan to ramp up Rotary membership and participation:

First, Wellness calls to the 14 members who rarely attend club meetings. We have a meeting every week with good programs. Calls will be made to the 14 missing in action.

Second, create Turnout Thursdays: pick a day (with sufficient notice) and see how many show up. Third, have each of us phone a friend in the next 60 days and invite him or her to a meeting. While high dues were once considered a barrier to joining, at \$225 a quarter, dues now amount to only \$2.50 per day (and they include lunch every week). Another \$25 a quarter for The Rotary Foundation amounts to only 28 cents more per day.

The Wellness calls will begin right away, by Ken and others.

As Mary Beth asked, do we realize what our members are doing, both within and apart from Rotary? She cited five Elmhurst Rotarians who have started their own charities, real grass-roots organizations with little or no overhead expense. They are Rotarians, doing good things for their fellow human beings.

Let's do more!
