Program

Holocaust survivor Eric Blaustein, a resident of Beacon Hill in Lombard, was today's program but was not feeling well enough this morning for the drive from Lombard. A recent acquaintance of Charlie Laliberte, Blaustein had intended to relate his story which included imprisonment at the Nazi concentration camp in Buchenwald.

Charlie gave a brief introduction and then we viewed segments from a YouTube video of Eric telling that story. Born in 1926, the discrimination began when he started first grade. Gradually, he and his family were forced into worse and worse living conditions. At age 15, he became a grave digger, a profession that made him useful to the Nazi regime.

While imprisoned at Buchenwald, he acquired the papers of a recently deceased Italian teenager and assumed his identity. Not arrested until 1944, he left Germany for Israel (then known as Palestine) where he eventually obtained a degree in civil engineering. Later moving to the United State, Blaustein used his education in designing one of the first projects in the Eisenhower Interstate Highway project.

Thanks to Charlie, Greg and Marilyn, who turned a cancellation into a captivating program.
