Other news: Elmhurst Rotarians will be helping unpack and distribute food pantry items at Churchville School at 9:15 am Saturday, April 13.

- -Tomorrow is the last day to apply for our club's fouryear scholarship (at \$4,000 per year).
- -We were saddened to learn that the Rotary Club of Bensenville has voted to disband.

Program: Introduced by Dave McKenna, Assist. City Manager Kent Johnson thanked Dave, quipping that those words were kinder than he expected. Kent quizzed us on city trivia, passing out trinkets for the closest guess for the miles of streets in Elmhurst (150), the number of trees in our parkways (22,000), the miles of water mains (184), etc.

- -Kent explained that water delivery and water treatment costs were increasing rapidly due to a lag in price adjustments during COVID and to government mandated wastewater treatment requirements. A typical residential water bill will increase by \$33 or \$34 a month.
- -As requested by residents, a French Market will appear soon on Sundays in the Elmhurst Library employee parking lot at Prospect and Park Avenues.
- -The cost for a new Elmhurst's train station has doubled, awaiting approvals from Union Pacific, Metra, and IDOT.
- -Filming for a TV show is taking place today and tomorrow at Addison and 2^{nd} streets.
- -Elmhurst is implementing an automated permitting process for remodeling, new construction, etc., doing away with cumbersome hand-written forms.
- -Thanks, Kent, for an action packed presentation.
