Following her driving vacation to the southeast last week, Finemaster Marilyn Boria took us on a virtual road trip today, asking questions about the interstate highway system, such as which president began the program, how highways are numbered, which interstate highway is the longest, when construction started, and "Can we get there from here?"

Sad news: The club observed a moment of silence for the three Rotarians who passed away recently: Dennis Sluga, Frank Mushow, and former member Jan Pauli.

Program

Josh Goralski, founder of Goralski & Assoc. Social Sector Consulting, described an effort to expand the manufacturing and distribution of simple water filtration systems and clean-burning stoves in Haiti.

A novel concept, the filtration pots are made from clay, sawdust (or rice hulls), water and nanosilver. The pots produce enough clean, clear and pleasant tasting water for a family of 5 to 10 people for two years at a cost of \$22 per pot. The effort includes training locals in the entrepreneurial business basics of selling products currently produced in Guatemala. A new, larger factory is underway in Haiti.

The group also makes clean-burning metal stoves (in Haiti) that use 50% less charcoal than traditional cooking methods, a big factor in Haiti where only 5% of the land is forested.

Thanks to Valerie Cahill and her YMCA connection for learning about these efforts to help Haitians help themselves while improving health and environmental conditions in Haiti.
